MDGs - SDGs

- MDG 2: “Achieve universal primary education” (EFA) has not been achieved globally in 2015
- SDG 4: “Quality Education” is in big disruption due to Covid19 pandemic.

Digital Transformation

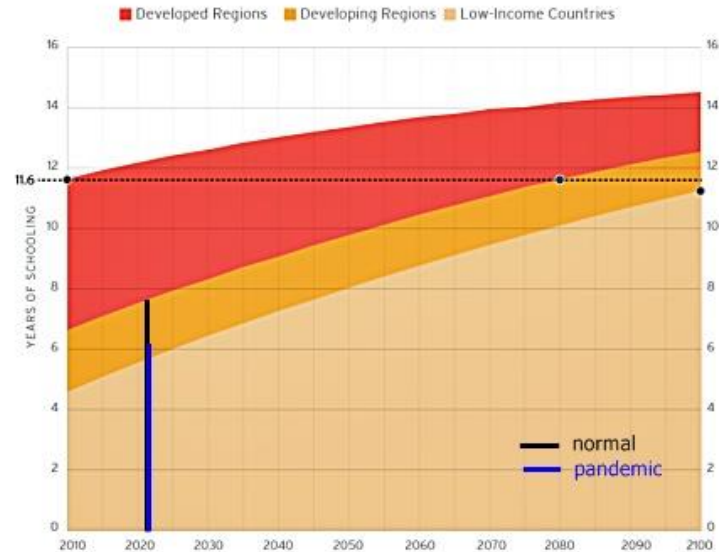
- 825 million children around the world not learning the skills they need and gap in access to education have been highlighted further by the Covid19 pandemic

Mean Years of Schooling



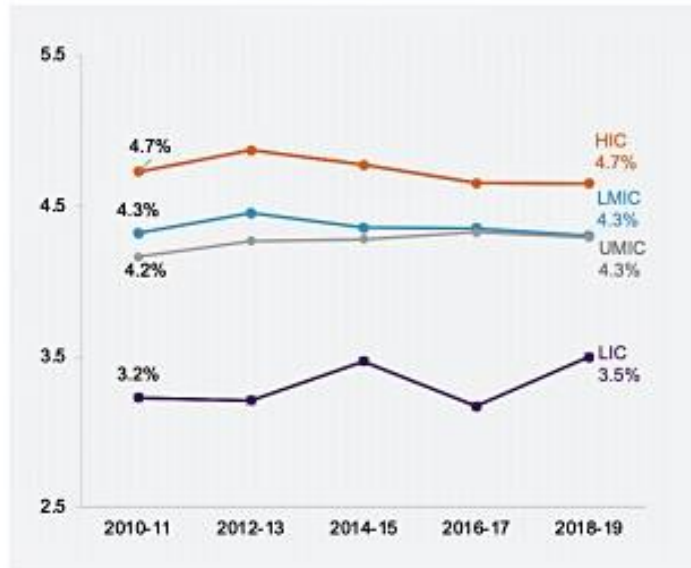
Mean Years of Schooling, Projections 2010-2100



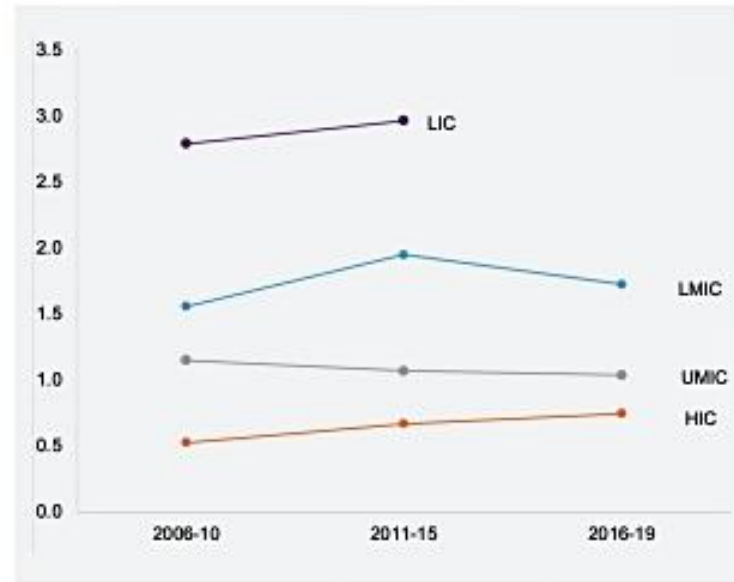

Total household education expenditure, % of GDP

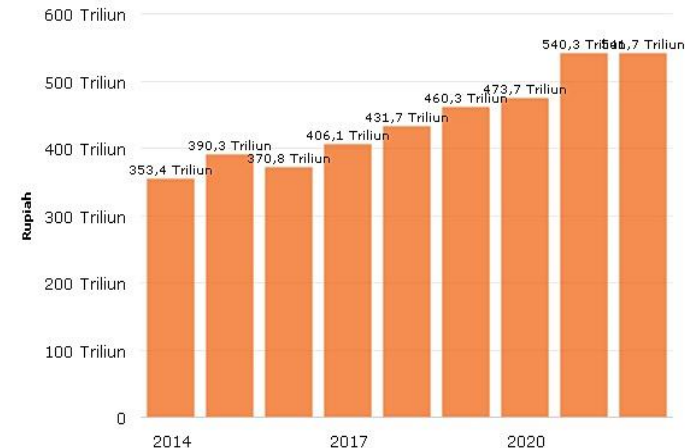

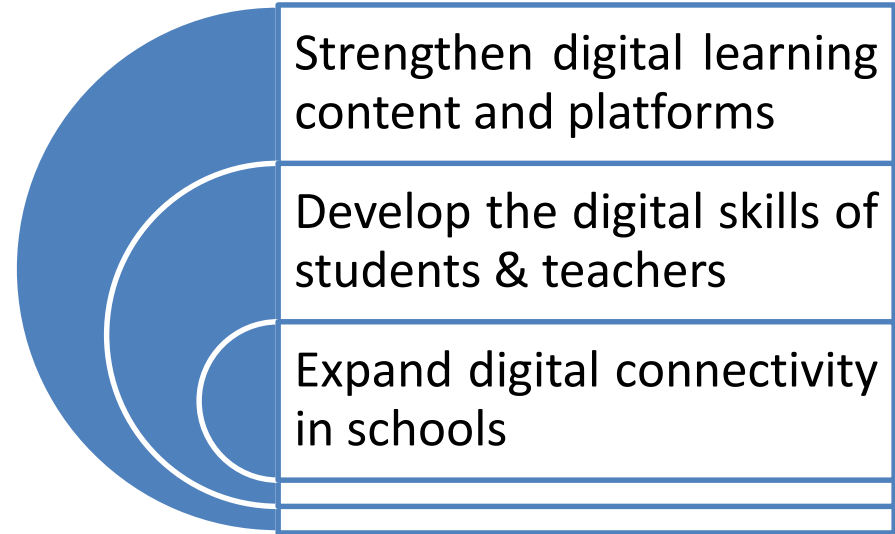

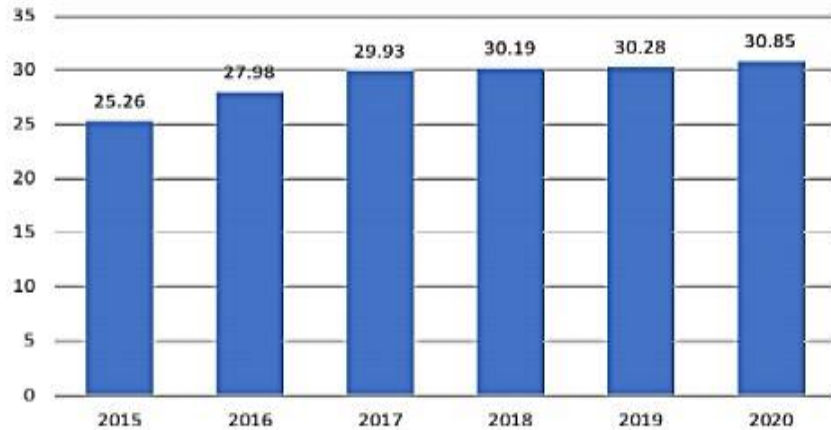

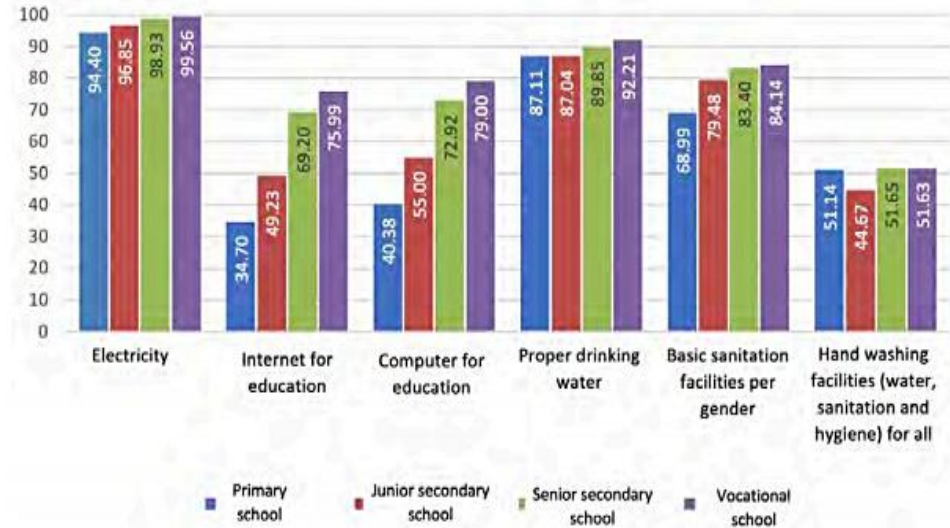

- Efficient resources allocation and careful risk analysis and management

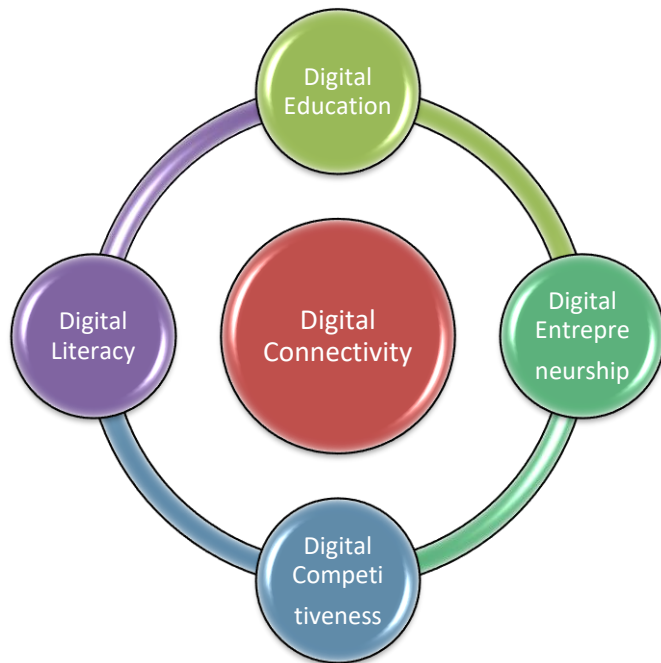
Public policy

- Maintaining public trust through policy credibility and integrity

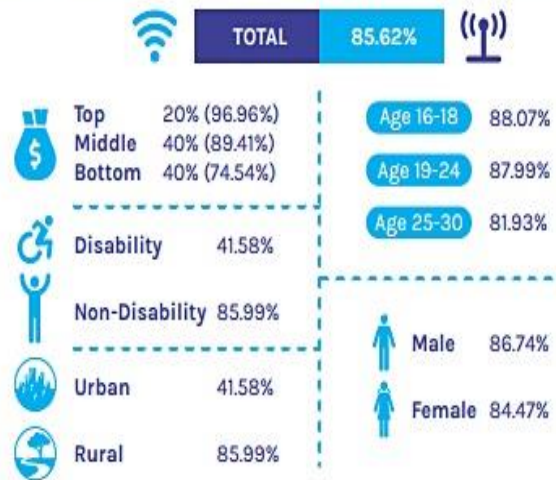

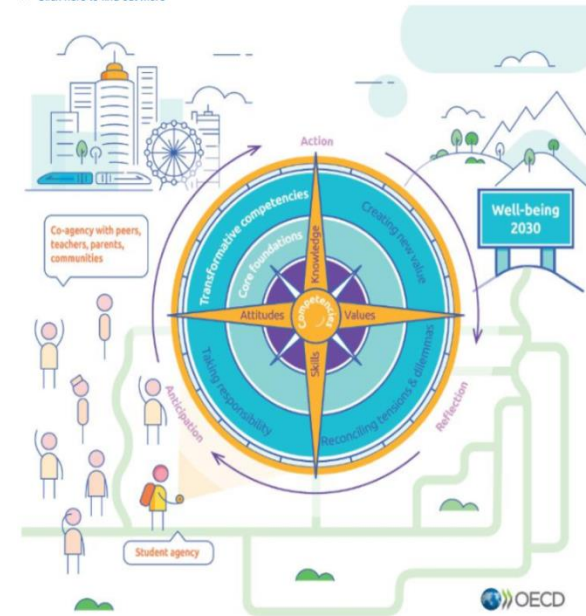
