Session Title: Implementing the SDGs at local and regional levels

- The experience of Argentina, Japan, the Gambia and South Africa underscore the value of localizing the SDGs and using the VLR process and reports to visualize SDGs, engage stakeholders, inform citizens of progress, gaps and challenges faced implementing global, national and local development agendas, plans and programmes.

Session Title: Means of Implementation and the Global Partnership

- Partnerships are effective ways to ensure successful transfer of know-how especially regarding equitable investment in physical and social infrastructure.
- Choosing green infrastructure over grey infrastructure for urban real estate may sacrifice faster financial returns, but the benefits of green infrastructure can be more widely distributed, leading to greater interest in its implementation and maintenance by various social groups.
- Need to embed incentives in by-laws and budgets for building political constituencies through multi-sector dialogue, demonstration projects, and capacity building.

Session Title: Governance

- Smart City solutions need to be respectful of local traditions, and local contexts. The end goal of smart city initiatives should not be to simply replicate another city's success, but to integrate these into the local environment.
