⁸ The field visit will provide the participants the knowledge about the actions of the Amazon Project, which is a regional initiative on water resources management. This project is based on a partnership between the ANA and ACTO. The project aims to enhance and integrate hydro-meteorological monitoring, institutional capacities, deepen knowledge, among other actions, involving all Member Countries (Bolivia, Brazil, Ecuador, Colombia, Guyana, Peru, Venezuela, and Suriname). These actions are directly related to achieving SDG 6.5 and strongly contribute to the achievement of SDG 6.5.1 and 6.5.2 in the South America region. During the visit, the spotlight will be on presenting participants with the facilities of the Situation Room, the Amazon Regional Observatory (ORA) and the Networks for Hydrological and Water Quality Monitoring in the Amazon basin.
