Together formed the Oracabessa Marine Trust


Model had success due to the high level of fisherfolk involvement and support.






Creation of 3 new fisher controlled fish sanctuaries



Awaiting Gazette: Lucea Harbour Fish Sanctuary








Awaiting Gazette: Grange Pen Fish Sanctuary
