

- Generating employment in fisheries industries and aquaculture farms;








At the Breaking Point

IUU FISHING at ASEAN REGION









Joint ASEAN Declaration on Regional Cooperation for Combating IUU Fishing and Enhancing the Competitiveness of ASEAN fish products adopted and being implemented

Regional Fishing Vessels Records (RFVR-24m) Established & Electronic ASEAN Catch Documentation System developed

Conducted 23 Cruises of Collaborative Scientific Research Surveys on Marine Resources and Marine Environment in SEA under the Cost-shared policy

1.16 Million ha Fisheries Refugia Established in the SCS and GOT with fishery law/legislation reformed for long-term sustainable management

FR Project provided capacity building at all levels, including government officers, academies, private sectors, communities, NGO/SCOs (About 7,000 stakeholders engaged in 300 activities)






