SDG Synergies



SDG Synergies helps to record, visualize and analyze how multiple targets are likely to interact in a given context. In doing so, it reveals deep patterns and relationships that would not be seen by simply looking at interactions between pairs of targets.



Case study: Mongolia and Colombia



The image shows the digital interface where stakeholders can score SDG interactions. This interface is accessed on a website and lets participants answer questions to score each SDG interaction by assessing the potential impacts, progress on one target would have on another. The Paris Agreement and Agenda 2030

The n NDC-SDG Connections tool, developed by SEI and the German Development Institute (Deutsches Institut für Entwicklungspolitik; DIE), analyses and quantifies the points of connection between the NDCs and the SDGs (at the level of headline goals and individual targets).

In doing so, it identifies potential points of synergy and opportunities for coordinated and coherent policy-making that can promote more effective and ambitious implementation of both agendas.

Strategic Collaborative Fund

SEI Asia, with support from the Swedish government (Sida), launched the **Strategic Collaborative Fund** programme (SCF) in 2018 to enhance the current 2030 Agenda efforts in Asia

SCF2 supports collaborative partnerships and policy dialogues that integrate gender and social equality and rights-based approaches for addressing transboundary environmental issues and environmental sustainability

2021 OUTREACH

In 2021, SCF2 supported **24 events** with **20 consortium partners** and brought together over **1,800 participants** from **764 organizations** in Asia and beyond, including policy actors, women, farmers, marginalized groups, youth, businesses, civil society organizations (CSOs), media and key stakeholders from diverse sectors.
