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



Empowerment of the most vulnerable groups (Para. 23):


- 1. "Children and Youth,
- 2. Persons with disabilities (+80% live in poverty),
- 3. People living with HIV/AIDS,
- 4. Older persons,
- 5. Indigenous peoples,
- 6. Refugees, internally displaced persons and migrants and
- 7. "People in areas affected by complex humanitarian emergencies and in areas affected by terrorism".

ONLY HALF (53%) OF URBAN RESIDENTS HAVE CONVENIENT ACCESS TO PUBLIC TRANSPORT (2018)



ONVENIENT ACCESS MEANS RESIDING WITHIN 500 M WALKING ISTANCE OF A BUS STOP/LOW-CAPACITY TRANSPORT SYSTEM ND 1000 M OF A RAILWAY OR FERRY TERMINAL
