



**Mr. Joyup Ahn**

Mr. Joyup Ahn is a labor economist and Senior Fellow at Korea Labor Institute. His research focus now is given to the dual labor market and youth employment, labor market mobility across industries and regions, and cooperatives. After receiving Ph.D. in economics from Ohio State University in 1997, Mr. Ahn joined University of Vermont to study co-residence and intergenerational private transfer for two years. Since 1999, Mr. Ahn has involved in helping government to make labor market policies, such as 5-day work and further reduction of working hours, mandatory retirement age, nonstandard work, and youth employment and in studying work in various cultural sectors, OECD Jobs Strategy, and ubiquitous work. Recently he finished 3-year project on work and happiness (2015~2017) and held international conference (2017) to find determinants in happiness of Koreans. As a policy expert, Mr. Ahn also served Minimum Wage Commission, Economic, Social & Labor Council, Seoul Labor Relations Commission, and Government Performance Evaluation Committee. Mr. Ahn was in charge of vice-president of Working Party (Department of Employment and Social Affairs) at OECD (2004~2011), was Exchange Scholar at George Washington University (2007~2010) and Visiting Scholar at Japan Institute of Labor Policy and Training (2002).
