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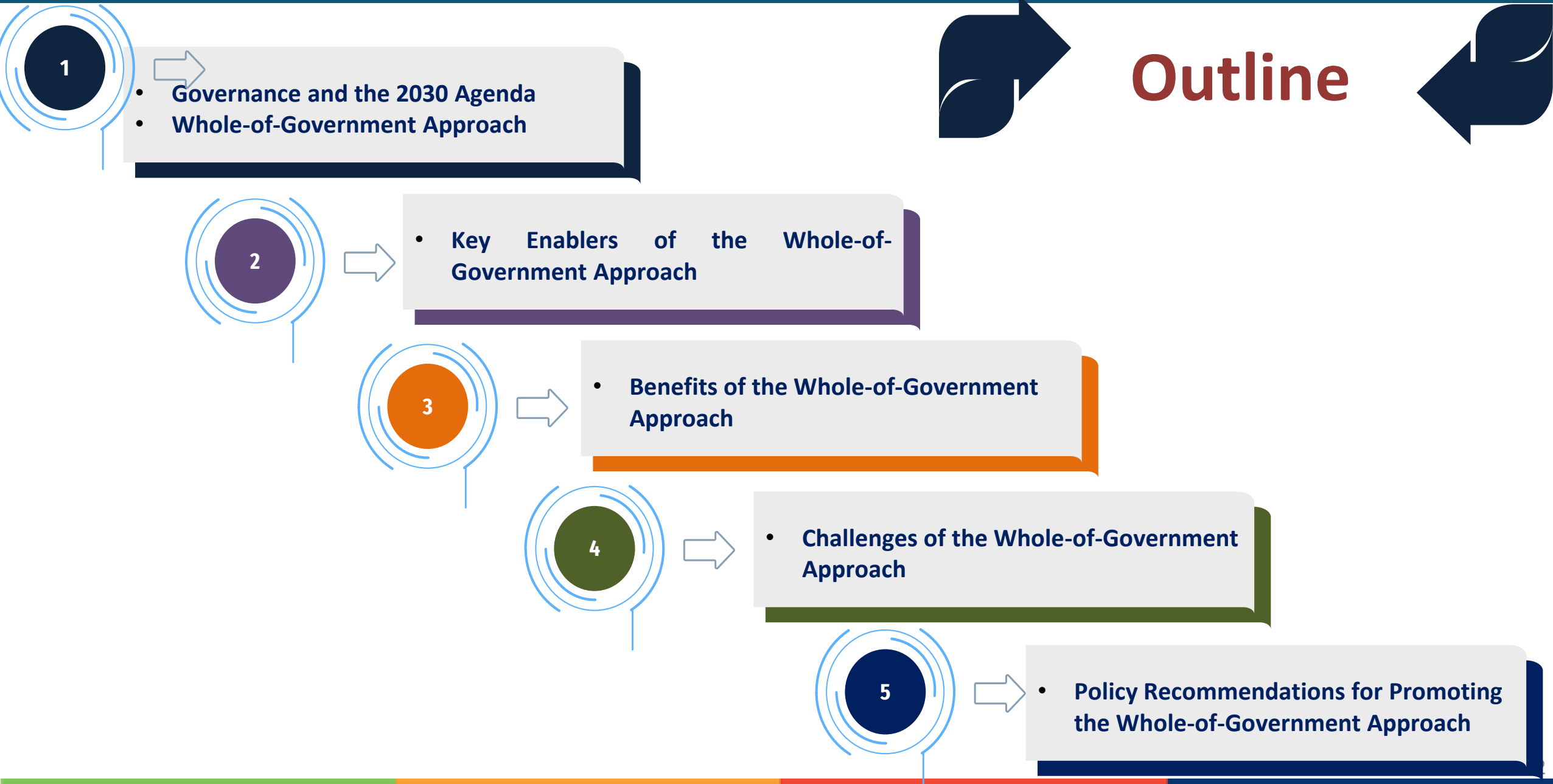

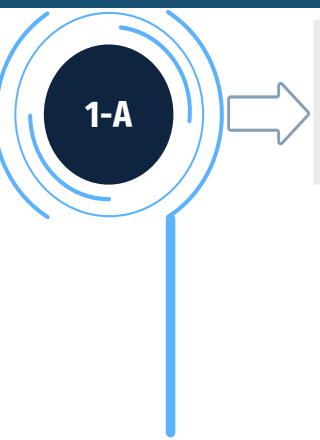

*“We will strive to equip domestic institutions to better address interlinkages, synergies and trade-offs between the Goals and targets through a **whole-of-government approach** that can bring about transformative change in governance and public policy and ensure policy coherence for sustainable development.”*

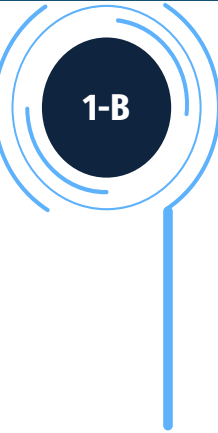

## • Whole-of-Government Approach

- Refers to a process where government actively uses formal and/or informal networks across the different agencies within that government to coordinate the design and implementation of the range of interventions that the government's agencies will be making in order to increase the effectiveness of those interventions in achieving the desired objectives.
- OECD 2007
- The **Whole-of-Government approach** is recognized in the declaration for 2030 Agenda which states that the SDGs are '**integrated** and **indivisible** and **balance** the three dimensions of sustainable development: the **economic**, **social** and **environmental**'
- UN DESA
- Basically, the term "**Whole-of-Government**" describes co-operation and co-ordination among different parts of government.

- Collaborative culture
- Legal and regulatory frameworks
- Clear and effective communication and information sharing channels
- Effective governance and management structures
- Adequate financial and human resources
- Monitoring and evaluation systems to measure the impact

- **Benefits of the Whole-of-Government Approach**

- Improved inter-ministerial coordination
- Facilitated cross-sectoral collaboration
- Improved efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery

- Better utilization of expertise and knowledge across govt. agencies
- Increased public trust and confidence in government agencies

- Challenges of the Whole-of-Government Approach

- Fragmented government structures
- Political instability
- Siloed mentality, organizational cultures and competing priorities
- Limited capacity and resources
- Inadequate institutional arrangements and lack of clarity on roles and responsibilities
- Limited understanding for interagency collaboration
- Resistance to change and a reluctance to embrace new ways
- Limited awareness of the WoG Approach

## Estonia's e-Residency Program


- ✓ Estonia's e-Residency program is a whole-of-government approach to creating a digital society.
- ✓ Estonia was the first country to offer e-Residency in 2014. It remains the most popular programme of its kind.
- ✓ The program allows individuals to become e-residents of Estonia and gain access to the country's digital infrastructure, such as its digital ID system, banking services, and business registration.
- ✓ This program is an innovative approach to building a digital society that aims to attract talent and entrepreneurs from around the world.

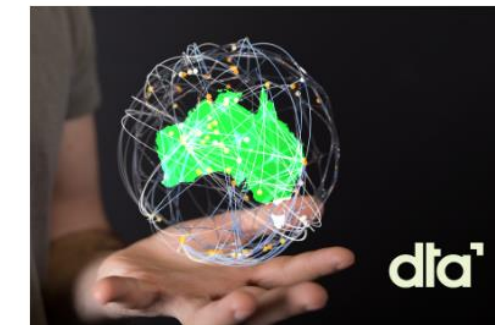
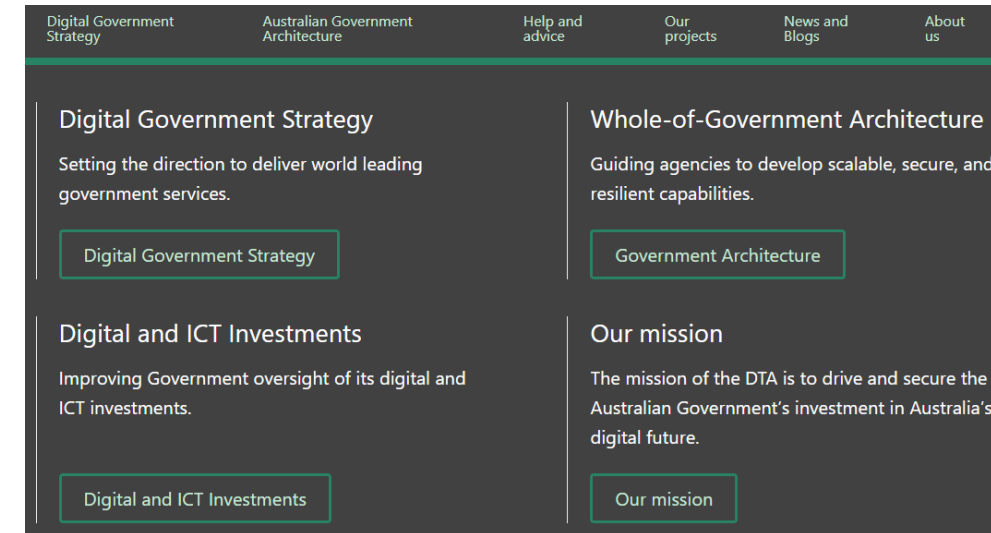

## Korea's Green New Deal (GND) – Republic of Korea

## Korea's Green New Deal Towards a Low-carbon Society

- ✓ Korea's Green New Deal (GND) is an ambitious plan to tackle climate change and promote sustainable development.
- ✓ It is a comprehensive and integrated approach that involves the **entire government**, including multiple ministries and agencies, as well as the private sector and civil society.
- ✓ Announced in July 2020, it plans to invest total 160 trillion won (about US\$144 billion) to create 1,901,000 jobs by 2025.
- ✓ The New Deal aims to transform the economy to make it greener, with more digital services and stronger safety nets.

- ✓ The Vision 2030 was developed through consultations with stakeholders and experts.

## Singapore's Whole-of-Government Approach to Smart Nation

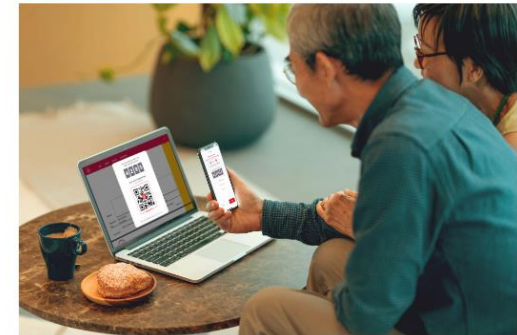
- ✓ The Smart Nation initiative in Singapore is a **whole-of-government approach** to digitize and modernize the country's infrastructure and services.
