Political Declaration by Heads of States - "Gearing up for a decade of Action"

"We will strive to equip domestic institutions to better address interlinkages, synergies and trade-offs between the Goals and targets through a whole-ofgovernment approach that can bring about transformative change in governance and public policy and ensure policy coherence for sustainable development." - (para 27 (d) of the Political Declaration at the UN GA, 15 October 2019)

Principles of effective governance for sustainable development

What are they for?

- » Building strong institutions at all levels
- » Serving as a reference point that brings together relevant standards and technical guidelines
- » Informing public sector reform initiatives for the SDGs

Where do they come from?

- » Developed by CEPA specifically for SDG implementation
- » Endorsed by the UN Economic and Social Council
- » Based on United Nations agreements

How can countries benefit from them?

- » As an analytical framework in policy formulation
- » As a guide in assessing institutional capacities, processes and culture
- » As a foundation of SDG awareness raising and training initiatives

Committee of Experts on Public Administration

CEPA is an expert body of the United Nations that studies and makes recommendations to improve governance and public administration structures and processes for development.



Whole-of-Government Approach

Refers to a process where government actively uses formal and/or informal networks across the different agencies within that government to coordinate the design and implementation of the range of interventions that the government's agencies will be making in order to increase the effectiveness of those interventions in achieving the desired objectives.

The <u>Whole-of-Government approach</u> is <u>recognized in the declaration for 2030</u> <u>Agenda</u> which states that the SDGs are 'integrated and indivisible and balance the <u>three dimensions</u> of sustainable development: the <u>economic</u>, <u>social</u> and <u>environmental</u>'

Basically, the term "Whole-of-Government" describes <u>co-operation</u> and <u>co-ordination</u>

among different parts of government.

Key Enablers of the Whole-of-Government Approach

- <u>Leadership</u> and <u>political will & commitment</u>
- Clear mandate, shared vision and institutional arrangements
- Collaborative culture
- <u>Legal and regulatory frameworks</u>
- Clear and effective communication and information sharing channel
- Effective governance and management structures
- Adequate financial and <u>human resources</u>
- Monitoring and evaluation systems to measure the impact





• Benefits of the Whole-of-Government Approach

- <u>Enhanced policy coherence</u> and <u>coordination</u> across govt. agencies
- Improved inter-ministerial coordination
- Facilitated <u>cross-sectoral collaboration</u>
- Improved <u>efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery</u>
- Improved <u>decision-making and resource allocation</u>
- Better <u>utilization of expertise and knowledge</u> across govt. agencies
- Increased public trust and confidence in government agencies





• Challenges of the Whole-of-Government Approach

- Fragmented government structures
- Political instability
- Siloed mentality, organizational cultures and competing priorities
- Limited capacity and resources
- <u>Inadequate institutional arrangements</u> and <u>lack of clarity on roles</u> and responsibilities
- Limited understanding for interagency collaboration
- Resistance to change and a reluctance to embrace new ways
- Limited awareness of the WoG Approach

Estonia's e-Residency Program

- ✓ Estonia's e-Residency program is a whole-of-government approach to creating a digital society.
- ✓ Estonia was the first country to offer e-Residency in 2014. It remains the most popular programme of its kind.
- √ The program allows individuals to become e-residents of Estonia and gain access to the country's digital infrastructure, such as its digital ID system, banking services, and business registration.
- ✓ This program is <u>an innovative approach to building a</u> <u>digital society</u> that aims to attract talent and entrepreneurs from around the world.




Australia's Digital Transformation Agency

- √ The DTA provides guidance and support to government agencies to help them transform their services and operations using digital technology.
- √ This approach is <u>an innovative way to improve</u> <u>government services</u> and make them more efficient and effective.

Korea's Green New Deal

Towards a Low-carbon Society

- ✓ Korea's Green New Deal (GND) is an ambitious plan to tackle climate change and promote sustainable development.
- ✓ It is a <u>comprehensive and integrated approach</u> that involves the <u>entire</u> government, including <u>multiple ministries and agencies</u>, as well as the private sector and civil society.
- ✓ Announced in <u>July 2020</u>, it plans to <u>invest total 160 trillion won (about US\$144 billion) to create 1,901,000 jobs by 2025.</u>
- √ The New Deal <u>aims to transform the economy to make it greener, with more digital services and stronger safety nets</u>.

SEOUL SOLUTION

- √ The <u>Seoul Metropolitan Government has been implementing various e-government services to enhance public service delivery</u> and promote citizen participation.
- √ These services include <u>online portals for various</u> <u>administrative services, mobile applications for public</u> <u>transportation and cultural events, and social media channels</u> <u>for citizen engagement.</u>
- √ The government has also established a digital innovation center to support the development of new e-government services.

Kenya's Vision 2030

- ✓ In 2008, the Kenyan government launched <u>Vision</u> 2030, which is a <u>long-term development plan to transform the country</u> into a middle-income, industrialized nation.
- √ The plan involves a whole-of-government approach, with <u>multiple government departments and agencies</u> working together to implement the program.
- √ The Vision 2030 was developed through consultations with stakeholders and experts.

- √ The Smart Nation initiative in Singapore is a whole-ofgovernment approach to digitize and modernize the country's infrastructure and services.

- Developing a <u>comprehensive implementation plan</u>
- Promoting <u>cross-functional and cross-departmental working groups</u>
- Developing <u>monitoring and evaluation frameworks</u> to track progress and assess the impact
