





What is Sustainable Development?

• Development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs (Brundtland 1987- Our Common Future)

The Millennium Declaration at the Millennium Summit New York, 6-8 Sept, 2000

In September 2000, World leaders adopted the <u>United Nations Millennium Declaration</u>, to reduce extreme poverty and setting out a series of time-bound targets with a deadline of 2015 - that have become known as the **Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)**







Silo


- A **silo** is a structure for storing <u>bulk materials</u>. Silos are used in <u>agriculture</u> to store <u>grain</u>.

- The **silo** mentality is believed to impact operations, reduce employee morale and may contribute to the overall failure of a company or its products and culture.













Figure 1: Map showing the distribution of VNR countries 2016-2019
