## **2022 Sustainable Development Transformation Forum**

25-28 October 2022, Incheon, Republic of Korea - In person

UNOSD organized the 2022 SDTF from 25 to 28 October 2022 in Incheon, Republic of Korea. The 2022 SDTF gathered nearly 100 participants from the Member States, public and private sector to support the stakeholders to gain better understanding of success, challenges, lessons learned, and good practices related to the implementation of SDGs 6, 7, 9, 11 and 17, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on these and across all the SDGs and identify ways to accelerate both the recovery from coronavirus disease and the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The Forum produced a communiqué, the Incheon Communiqué, summarizing the key messages which participants would like to address to the international community regarding the successes, lessons learned and good practices they identified in relation to the implementation of the selected SDGs as well as the main theme of the Forum, i.e., accelerating the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels. The 2022 SDTF was co-organized by the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF).

## "Water in the World We Want" Phase 3: Accelerating the achievement of water-related SDGs Asia Regional Workshop

23-24 November 2022, Daegu, Republic of Korea - In person

UNOSD held the "Water in the World We Want" Phase 3: Accelerating the achievement of water-related SDGs Asia Regional Workshop in Daegu, Republic of Korea during the Korea International Water Week from 23 to 24 November 2022. The workshop invited 30 water professionals, policymakers, and researchers from Bangladesh, Cambodia, Mongolia, Saudi Arabia, Tajikistan, Turkey, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lebanon, the State of Palestine, Uzbekistan, Yemen, Pakistan and the Republic of Korea.

Through the workshop, the participants shared experiences, challenges, and possibilities in achieving SDG 6 at the national level, learned how to utilize the SDG-PSS as a tool for strengthening evidence-based policymaking on water-related areas and facilitating an enabling environment for achieving SDG 6 at the national level, and discussed ways to extend the use of SDG-PSS through regional cooperation.

The event was co-organized by UN University - Institute for Water, Environment, and Health (INWEH), UNESCO International Centre for Water Security and Sustainable Management (i-WSSM), and K-water.

Side Event at the UN-Water Groundwater Summit on "To the UN 2023 Water Conference: A Multistakeholder Approach for Accelerating Gender Equality"

6 December 2022, Paris, France - Hybrid

On 6 December 2022, UNOSD organized a side event at the UN-Water Groundwater Summit on "To the UN 2023 Water Conference: A Multi-stakeholder Approach for Accelerating Gender Equality" in Paris, France. The event was coorganized by the African Ministers' Council on Water (AMCOW), UNESCO International Centre for Water Security and Sustainable Management (i-WSSM), and the United Nations University - FLORES.

This side event will showcase the work of the WWAP-led Global Multi-

Stakeholders Coalition to accelerate progress towards gender equality in water with focus on solutions and good practices. It will also discuss the formulation of a joint strategy by the Multi-stakeholder Coalition that fits within the Water Action Agenda for the UN 2023 Water Conference. The session builds on the outcomes of the African Regional Consultations (Addis Ababa, June 2022) and paves the way for integrated educational programmes, promoting gender equality among future water leaders.

During the summit, UNOSD met with experts and stakeholders on water from different countries and organizations to further develop its network and partnership. Mr. Chun Kyoo Park, the Head of UNOSD, also attended the opening ceremony of the Korea Water Resources Corporation (K-water) Europe Center.

# Side Event at the 27th Conference of the Parties of UNFCCC

10 & 14 November 2022, Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt - In person

From 6 to 18 November 2022, the Government of the Arab Republic of Egypt hosted the 27th Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC (COP 27) in Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt. At COP 27, UNOSD organized two side events at the SDG Pavilion hosted by the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) and the Korea Pavilion hosted by the Government of Republic of Korea. UNOSD also held bilateral meetings with other stakeholders to discuss possible areas of partnership and collaboration.

The first side event on "exploring approaches to mitigation target setting for NDC updates" was held on 10 November 2022 at the Korea Pavilion. The event focused on exploring experiences of various countries in setting their own emission mitigation targets in NDCs with a view to introduce the approaches used for different mitigation goal types including base year emissions goal, base year intensity goal, and baseline scenario goal. The invited speakers also shared their experiences, best practices, and lessons learned on setting national mitigation targets.

The second side event titled "Enhancing Capacity of Developing Countries in the Asia-Pacific Region to Raise Climate Ambition" took place on 14 November 2022 at the SDG Pavilion. The event aimed to identify the capacity needs and gaps to accelerate more ambitious climate action and ultimately achievement of the SDGs by 2030. The event also showcased efforts to support government officials and experts in designing and implementing their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).




### **UNOSD Internship**



### **2022 E-Government Survey**

The United Nations E-Government Survey 2022 is the 12th edition of the United Nations' assessment of the digital government landscape across all 193 Member States. The E-Government Survey is informed by over two decades of longitudinal research, with a ranking of countries based on the United Nations E-Government Development Index (EGDI), a combination of primary data (collected and owned by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs) and secondary data from other UN agencies.

Through the cooperation with the National Statistical Offices, official demographic statistics are compiled in the Yearbook, as available, for more than 230 countries and areas of the world up to the reference year 2021. This edition of the Yearbook contains chapters on the population



size and distribution, the population of capital cities, fertility, foetal mortality, infant and maternal mortality, general mortality, nuptiality and divorce.
